Arabic is easy, yet difficult! Easy when dedicated, difficult when not!

In this lesson, **Surah Ikhlāas** was discussed and the following rules were explained:

1. It was explained that most Arabic words have 3 root letters which are termed as trilateral words. Other words have 4 root letters whilst a few words have 5 root letters. The most important principle is identifying the root letters, which allows one to identify the meaning.

One should focus on:

- a) How to identify the root letters.
- b) Learn different forms of root letters.

Once one has learnt the above two, one has learnt 70-80% of the language.

e.g. حَمِدَ - to praise

حَامِدٌ - one who praises.

مَحْمُودٌ - One who has been praised.

أَحْمَدٌ - superlative - أَفْعَلُ

مُحَمَّدٌ - one who has been praised excessively

حَمَّادٌ - one who praises excessively.

By adding letters to the root letters, the meaning becomes more emphasised

💡 It is extremely important to learn the usage of the Arabic dictionary.

A recommended dictionary is the Hans Wehr Dictionary.

The root letters are mentioned first, thereafter the secondary and derivative words will be located.
